SAMPLE OF DESTINATIONS

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON

The Emerald City of the Pacific Northwest: Seattle's stately skyline sparkles against a backdrop of inland seas and snowcapped mountains. Shop glittering downtown, the bustling Farmers' Market, historic Pioneer Square where the city began. See it all from the top of the Space Needle.

INSIDE PASSAGE (SCENIC CRUISING)

The scenic waterway that reaches 1,000 miles from beautiful British Columbia to historic Skagway, Alaska. You'll cruise through a maze of bays, straits, arms and majestic glacier-carved fjords, past an ever-changing panorama of cascading waterfalls and unspoiled virgin forests. And visit some of the friendliest little towns in the world: Ketchikan, Juneau, Skagway and Sitka.

KETCHIKAN, ALASKA

With 3,000-foot-high Deer Mountain looming behind, there never was much room for Ketchikan to expand. So, much of the town is built on trestles, docks and pilings at water's edge. Explore historic Creek Street, now a covey of contemporary art galleries and quaint boutiques. Meet the spirits of the raven, whale and eagle as you view the largest collection of totems in the world at Totem Bight State Historical Park. Flightsee Misty Fjords National Monument.

TRACY ARM & SAWYER GLACIERS (HALF-DAY SCENIC CRUISING)

Sheltered waters wind through 7,000-foot mountain peaks and nearly vertical rock cliffs laced with waterfalls. At the head of Tracy Arm, the twin Sawyer Glaciers calve icebergs into the jade-colored inland sea. Mountain goats, seals and whales are common sights in this magical place, where closeness and intimacy make visitors a part of the scene.



SKAGWAY, ALASKA

The northernmost port on the Inside Passage, Skagway is where the prospectors of 1898 gathered their provisions for the grueling trip over the mountains to the Klondike gold fields. Explore the false-fronted buildings within the Klondike Gold Rush National Historic Park. Ride Skagway's first sightseeing streetcar to "All Points of Interest." Follow in the footsteps of the Stampeders as you traverse the Trail of '98 in a vintage parlor car of the White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad.

SITKA, ALASKA

Tlingit Native American and Russian czarist-era culture are showcased in a temperate rain forest setting along Sitka National Historical Park's spectacular coastal trail. This one-time capital of Russian America reflects its rich heritage under the onion domes of the Orthodox St. Michael's Cathedral.

HUBBARD GLACIER (HALF-DAY SCENIC CRUISING)

From its source on Mount Logan in

the Yukon Territory, Hubbard Glacier stretches 76 miles to the sea at Yakutat and Disenchantment bays. It is the longest tidewater glacier in Alaska, with an open calving face over five miles wide. Currently advancing, the "Galloping Glacier" is still living up to the nickname given to it in 1986.

JUNEAU, ALASKA

Alaska's capital city is named after Joe Juneau, a gold miner who once wept openly because he'd made more money than he could possibly spend in a lifetime. (He hadn't; he died broke!) Step ashore to shop for gold nuggets, experience a true Alaskan cookout at the Gold Creek Salmon Bake, flightsee the Juneau Ice Field, visit the mighty Mendenhall Glacier just outside town.

VICTORIA, BRITISH COLUMBIA

The most English city outside of England, Victoria boasts a beautiful harbor, high tea at the stately Empress Hotel, historic museums and the world-famous Butchart Gardens.
